Timeline-when did this happen?

All stories covered in the unit happened in the Old Testament-Before Christ. BC stands for "Before Christ" and is a way to count years before the estimated birth of Jesus Christ. It's used in the Christian calendar and is one of the ways years are labeled on the Gregorian calendar, the most widely used calendar in the world.

How it works

BC counts backward from the year before Jesus's birth, 1 BC, to 10,000 BC

- To have an understanding of key religious stories.
- What are religious stories and what do they symbolise.
- To know why old testament stories may still be significant today.
