
Pop art - a style of art based on modern popular culture and media, very different to traditional art styles

Key facts/info:

Andy Warhol: 6 Aug 1928 - 22 Feb 1987 He was an American artist, film director and producer who was a leading figure in the visual art movement known as pop art who used repeated patterns in his work.

Alexander Calder July 22, 1898 – November 11, 1976) Abstract artist



Key Artists/Movements:

Andy Warhol – Pop art Alexander Calder Sketching Still life

Assessment piece - create a mixed media spiral picture, paying homage to Calder and Warhol with repeated contrasting coloured panels

Lesson 1	Learn about Andy Warhol and his pop art style. Note how Warhol uses repeated patterns and contrasting colours in his work.
Lesson 2	Learn about Alexander Calder's spiral based pop art. Compare and contrast with Warhol. Which do you prefer and why?
Lesson 3	Learn how to draw a spiral using your pencil and create lots of different spirals of different shapes and sizes in your sketchbooks
Lesson 4	Continue to develop spiral drawings using colour (chalk, pastel, dry media)
Lesson 5	Assessment piece - create a mixed media spiral picture, paying homage to Calder and Warhol with repeated contrasting coloured panels
