## **Key Vocabulary:**

missionary - someone who is sent on a religious mission to promote their religion in a foreign country. They show care & concern as they help people in foreign countries who are previously strangers to them.

clergy - leaders within religions. Their roles is to spread the word about their religion.

Evangelism - the spreading of Christianity. Evangelists show care & concern to everyone as they want everyone to experience God's love.

care & concern - the act of watching over or tending; protection. Caring means to look after someone.

responsibility - the duty to have to deal with something or take charge.

#### How did it begin?

Christianity originally developed as part of Judaism. Jesus was a Jew. Christianity as we know it was formed by Jesus and his disciples.

#### Important beliefs & teachings:

Jesus teaches that we should care for everyone, even strangers and people who are not well liked. This is shown through the parables of 'The Good' Samaritan' and 'The Story of Zacchaeus'. God loves and forgives.

Jesus and God also taught that we must follow religious law. Jesus taught that we have a responsibility to follow the 10 Commandments from God.

A key teaching for care and concern is seen through the story of the 'Nativity' as baby Jesus is cared for by everyone and the kind inn keeper gives them a stable when there was nowhere else to stay.
