Timeline-when did this happen?

Jesus was born just over 2000 years ago.

The Christian religion began following the crucifixion of Jesus in the 1st century AD.

Essential Knowledge:

- To understand the importance of various religious artefacts to the Easter Story.
- Why Easter is important to many Christians.
- Understand what happened on Palm Sunday and why most people were delighted to welcome Jesus.
- Understand that there were certain groups of people who weren't as welcoming to Jesus when he arrived at Jerusalem and explain why.
- Understand who the disciples were and what they did to help and support Jesus.

Spiritual – Awareness of how Christians perceive this important Christian festival and what it means to them. Awareness of how stories and traditions are passed through the generations.

Moral – Understand that it is not always easy to do the right thing, it is important to forgive and also important to be kind to ourselves and others.
