ENQUIRY QUESTION: Why might pilgrimages help people on their life's journey? What path would you like your life to take?

Pilgrimage	A journey, especially a long one, made to a sacred place as an act of religious devotion.
Pilgrim	A person who undertakes a pilgrimage.

Although people go on pilgrimages for different reasons, religious pilgrimages have the following things in common:

- Making the plans'
- Saving for the trip.
- Undertaking the trip.
- The journey and the arrival at the sacred place.
- To say sorry to their god.
- Undertaking a pilgrimage is part of their religious teaching.
- Because they may be ill or wish to be healed.
- To gain a feeling of closeness to their god.

Pilgrimages:

First made to sites connected with the birth, life, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.
