artefact - an object from a different culture or time that helps us to find out more

old fashioned – something that looks like it is from the past

decades – 10 years

plastic - a man-made material that can be moulded into shape while soft and then set into a rigid shape.

metal - a solid material which is typically hard & can be shiny

wooden - to be made of wood

threadbare - to become thin & tattered/ worn with age

Timeline of Events:

1902	Roosevelt bear hunt and teddy bear named
1950/60s	Potential era of children's grandparents
1980s-90s	Potential era of children's parents
2016/17	Children were born
2022	New babies born—our current year

Lesson 1	What is history? Discuss own historical timeline.
Lesson 2	What kind of toys do you enjoy playing with today and why? Bring in your toy to discuss. How does it work? What is it made from? What does it do?
Lesson3	Introducing a grandparent/great grandparent. Locate grandparents age in timeline in comparison to them. Plan simple questions to ask the grandparent to find information about the past.
Lesson 4	Grandparent visit to discuss old toys—children to find answers to simple questions about the past from sources.
Lesson 5	Look at a range of toys from the past. Ask simple questions . Recognise the difference between toys from the past and present, sort toys and explain your choices.
Lesson 6	Introduction to the story of Teddy Roosevelt from various sources (Discuss looking at several sources for reliable information.
Lesson 7	To analyse secondary sources and find the provenance.— is the story of Roosevelt definitely the true origin of the bear? (Introduction of the Steiff bear)
Lesson 8	Investigate how teddy bears have changed through time. Describe the similarities and differences between them.
	Compare two teddy bears from distinctly different periods time and annotate features
Lesson 9	Assessment piece: Would you prefer to have toys from when your grandparents were small or play with toys from today.
