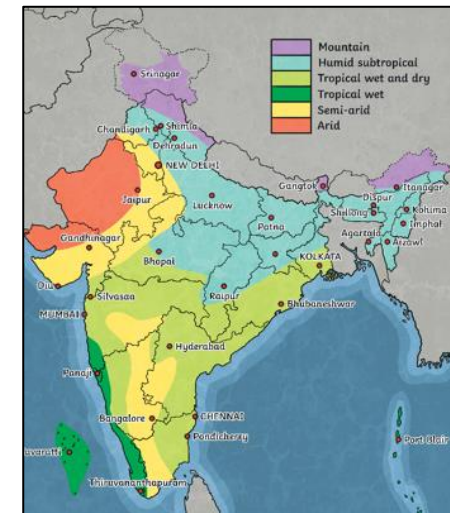


Key facts/statistics:
