

UNIFORM POLICY

Background

At Birkenhead High School Academy, we set high expectations for all our students. We expect them to come to school wearing the correct uniform and looking smart and tidy at all times.

Principles

We feel it is important that all students should be properly dressed enabling a sense of pride and selfesteem as well as being a credit to Birkenhead High School Academy. We also wish to remain accessible and inclusive to all our families.

- Correct school uniform is to be worn throughout the day and on the journey to & from school
- No make-up or nail varnish may be worn with school uniform
- Hair dye of any colour is not acceptable in school
- In Senior School, hair should be tied back in a neat ponytail or down straight
- In Junior School, hair should be tied back, neatly, at all times. Hair accessories should be black/white (in winter) or pink/white (in summer) and unobtrusive.
- No jewellery is permitted other than stated below:
 - In Senior School: a watch and one pair of small, plain ear studs are permitted in the <u>bottom</u> lobe of the ears. We do not accept any other studs higher up in the lobes of the ears or body piercings.
 - In Junior School: a watch is permitted, but no other jewellery. **No earrings are permitted in Junior School at any time.**

WINTER UNIFORM

Nursery: Black tracksuit trousers

White polo shirt (logo optional)

Light blue sweat top or cardigan (logo optional)

Plain black winter coat (BHSA waterproof coat optional – must be black only)

Black socks

Black school shoes (with Velcro fastening and not PE pumps)

BHSA book bag (up to Year 1)

Reception: Plain black waterproof coat (school coat optional; otherwise must be plain black only)

If worn, scarves to be school (optional) or black and/or white

School dress, as supplied by the school shop: black flared tunic or new style school dress [Students have the option of wearing plain black school trousers, white shirt and tie]

White polo shirt (logo optional)
Black shoes with Velcro fastening
¾ length black socks or black tights

Medium grey, plain v-neck pullover or cardigan, classic style (logo optional)

Nur to Year 6: Pink striped summer dress

[Students have the option of wearing plain black school trousers, white shirt and tie]

Medium grey, plain v-neck pullover or cardigan, classic style (logo optional)

White ankle socks (no frills) or white plain ¾ length socks

Flat, black shoes, laced or bar only (no casual, slip-on styles, no flashing lights or tags)

(in Nursery and Reception, a Velcro fastening)

School blazer (compulsory from Year 3 upwards, optional for lower years)

Optional red waterproof

Blue polo shirt (logo optional)

Blue sweat top (logo optional) – round neck

Years 3 to 6: Blue sweat top (round neck) with or without hood

Blue Aertex-type PE top (logo optional)

Black jogging bottoms

Black shorts

School hockey socks (as seniors)

White short socks

Gum guard – Opro or Shock Doctor makes only or from your dentist

BHSA swimming hat

Plain black swimming costume

Optional black woolly hat with school badge (or plain black)

Years 5&6: 'skort' (combined skirt & shorts)

YEAR 7 to YEAR 11

Blazer* Black girls' blazer as supplied by Wirral Uniform Centre

Coat* Black reversible jacket fleece lined with the logo on one side only, as supplied

by Wirral Uniform Centre. No other jacket is acceptable.

Scarf (Optional) black & white official school scarf available from Wirral Uniform

Centre or plain black. No other scarf may be worn.

Hijab If a hijab is worn, it must be plain black

Hair fastenings should be black or white only. Hairbands should be narrow and

plain black or white. Narrow black or white ribbons are also acceptable. Long

hair must be tied back where safety requires.

Skirt Back pleated official school skirt as supplied by Wirral Uniform Centre. Only

official style may be worn.

Trousers (optional) Black straight leg official school trousers as supplied by Wirral Uniform Centre.

Only the official style may be worn.

Blouse White official rever collar school blouse from Wirral Uniform Centre

Jumper * Black official school v-neck jumper as supplied by Wirral Uniform Centre

Shoes Plain, flat black school shoes (e.g. no bows) Black pumps (e.g. Converse) are not

permitted

Boots Black boots may be worn to school in very cold weather. (No UGG boots or

similar). These may <u>not</u> be worn indoors, but should be changed for shoes.

Socks or tights Opaque, black tights or ankle socks, black shoes (no bows on socks)

Bag* Rucksack with school logo as supplied by Wirral Uniform Centre

Senior School Games & P.E. Kit

ALL KIT IS AVAILABLE FROM THE WIRRAL UNIFORM CENTRE

Compulsory:

PE skort Black skort, with sky blue inserts

Sports top * Black with sky blue inserts

Hoodie * Black hoodie with sky blue inserts

Tracksuit bottoms Black with sky blue piping or plain black (optional)

Leggings * Black with BHSA logo (only to be worn for gymnastics, dance & athletics

activities)

Hockey socks Black, ¾ length with sky blue turnover

Games socks White, ankle length

Training shoes White with cushioned soles (not leisure shoes such as Converse)

Astro-turf shoes Essential – any sports outfitters

Gum shield Mouthguards are advisable (and compulsory for matches)

Swimming costume One piece, any colour

Swimming towel

Black sports bag Suitable for sports kit/swimming kit. Must be able to fit in school locker

Shinpads With ankle protectors

All items, with the exception of socks, should be clearly labelled with the students' name

Sixth Form Dress Code

Blazer/cardigan/jumper This can be in any colour

Top This can be any colour/pattern/style, providing it is not too low cut,

made of sheer fabric or carrying an offensive slogan/image. Crop tops

are not allowed.

Trousers These can be any colour/pattern but should be smart. **Blue denim is not**

allowed. Ripped jeans are also not allowed.

Skirt This can be any colour/pattern

Dress This can be any colour/pattern

Shoes Appropriate footwear should be worn. Trainers are not allowed.

Hair, make-up & piercings Make-up should be minimal/natural and hair colour should not be

overly vibrant. Facial piercings are allowed but should be minimal

(studs)

Tattoos Tattoos must be kept covered up at all times

Formal occasions A blazer and shirt with skirt/trousers should be worn at formal

occasions e.g. open evenings, prizegiving etc.

Roles & Responsibilities

- Vice Principal & Head of Junior School to monitor and review the uniform and uniform policy annually, ensuring that the uniform is of good quality whilst remaining affordable
- Class teachers, form tutors & progress leaders to monitor uniform on a daily basis
- All staff to be proactive and challenge students not following the uniform rules
