Dear Parents/Carers

Much as we had hoped that this term would have looked more familiar, of course, we remain unable to have all of our girls in school – as is the case for our 24 sister GDST schools. And while we are proud to be able to provide our guided home learning programme, and offer the best teaching and learning experience we can, we want to do more.

Reading is something that is very close to our hearts here at BHSA, and where we have made enormous headway since 2016. One example is the success of our Reading Discovery Programme which sees our current Sixth Form students paired with girls from nursery and right through junior school to encourage reading and talking about the stories together.

Sadly, right now this hugely impactful initiative is not feasible and with so much of learning (and life) now online, the delight and escape of opening a storybook is, we think, more important than ever. Stories allow children to be transported to different worlds, cultures and times in history. They spark imagination and creativity, teach valuable life lessons and can provide comfort and reassurance.

To date, we've relied heavily on the outstanding efforts of our Parents' Association to help us buy extra (noncurriculum) books for our girls; but with the pandemic putting a stop to their fundraising activities, along with the closure of public libraries during lockdown, we worry that our girls simply aren't able to access new books and the joy that comes with reading.

or in person if they are at school.

This initiative is being run in partnership with our local independent bookshop, <u>Linghams Booksellers</u> in Heswall.
