






October - Black History Month and National Poetry Day Celebration






Othello Theatre Visit

This half term year 11, 12 and 13 drama students visited the Liverpool playhouse to see Othello performed by Frantic Assembly and directed by Scott Graham. The students were enthralled by Shakespeare's tragedy of paranoia, power and murder. Frantic Assembly did a fantastic, powerful, energetic and cinematic performance in their portrayal of the story. This contemporary performance was set in a run down pub clearly which highlighted the relevance to a 21st century audience as Othello unshielded the tension, fear and paranoia buried beneath the veneer of some relationships and how easily that can be maliciously exploited. It was fantastic to see our students engage so well with this poetic Shakespearean play and to appreciate the powerful use of physical skills that were deployed to retell this famous play. All our students were inspired, they enjoyed a positive and creative experience; it was pleasing to hear them analyse and evaluate the performance and design elements and share their personal response to the performance.

Each year it offers a unique opportunity for youth theatre groups to stage new plays written for young people by some of theatre's most exciting playwrights, and to perform and work with leading people in the creative industry. This year BHSA students will be performing 'The Heights' by Lisa McGee. This is a play about stories. Lillie is a teenager who lives on the Heights Estate. A place where nothing ever happens, except in Lillie's head. Lisa McGee is a playwright and screenwriter from Northern Ireland. She is the creator and writer of Derry Girls, the hit television comedy series (Channel 4, 2018-22). National Connection preparations have commenced during enrichment, the students are excited to begin the rehearsal process. The final performance will take place at the Lowry Theatre in Salford during the spring term.

Congratulations to Patience Wood in Year 11, who has won Wirral Young Athlete of the Year. This outdoor season, Patience has represented GB at the European Youth Cup and European Championships achieving 2 European Records, 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 1 bronze medal. She won the Under 18 UK Junior Masters Championships and the Under 16 Junior National Championships. She won Gold recently for Cheshire in the Senior U.K National County Championships. She is currently ranked 4th under 18 in Europe and is also as an Ambassador for Archery GB and has given workshops and have a go sessions to numerous charities and even promoted active sessions for seniors in nursing homes.

She is due to compete internationally at a Senior level (as an adult) in Holland (November) and Berlin (December) and if she then qualifies high enough at the European Indoor Championships in Turkey (February).
